Internship Summary:

This internship will provide the interested party with a general understanding of collections care and management, registration methods, and museum best practices. The intern will be focused assisting with the *We Are Texas* material culture review, namely verifying catalog numbers, research into provenance and accession records, and data entry.

Summary of Responsibilities:

Typical tasks include assisting the Collections Team with the following:

- Research objects within the Collections records, identified through the We Are Texas
 material culture review, confirming individual catalog numbers
- Research provenance in accession records
- Create records using the collection management database, Re:Discovery Proficio
- Assist with other projects, such as exhibition installation or deinstallation, as needed

Required Qualifications:

- Enrolled in an undergraduate or graduate degree program at an accredited institution in museum studies, history, anthropology, or related field.
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills.
- Exhibit attention to detail, precision in execution of work, and critical thinking skills.
- Ability to work independently or collaboratively with others.
- Interested in or has an understanding of museum best practices and standards.
- Understanding of collection management databases, particularly Re:Discovery Proficio.
